Welding Class Rules and Shop Dress Code

Students in the Weld Shop are **REQUIRED** to wear:

- 1. Regular fit blue jeans, no holes or frays. (no baggie pants or sweatpants, nylon clothing or shorts)
- 2. Leather work boots 8 inch all leather, no nylon-must be tied
- 3. Long hair must be pulled back
- 4. No jewelry/earrings while in the shop
- 5. No ball caps, hats or hoodies
- 6. Clear lens safety glasses (must be worn at all times)
- 7. No cell phones or electronic devices allowed in shop (safety concerns)

Proper PPE (Personal Protective Equipment)

- 1. Welding helmet
- 2. Welders cap
- 3. Green or leather welding jacket
- 4. Safety glasses (must be worn at all times)
- 5. 8 inch high leather (no nylon) boots, must be tied at all times
- 6. Work gloves
- 7. Heavy duty welding gloves for Labor, Stick, Mig, Tig welding

- 3. Always OBEY all safety rules and procedures.
- 4. Treat equipment with respect.
- 5. Work with a positive attitude about completing your assignments.
